
How to Pitch a Book Proposal to Skybridgepress.com

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Purpose

The procedure for making a book proposal to Skybridge Press Corporation. Submit your proposal via email at contact@skybridgepress.com.

Proposal Contents

Present a one to two page proposal containing exactly the following data:

1. Subject matter, proposed title. Give the main subject matter of your book.
2. Outline (if the outline makes the proposal exceed two pages, present only the main headings of the outline, omitting subparts).
3. Target market data. Identify your target audience and why they would be interested in your particular treatment of the subject matter of your book. Explain differences between your book and other similar titles.
4. Your curriculum vitae along with an explanation of why you are qualified to write about this subject matter (the CV does not count toward two-page total).
5. Any additional information, not exceeding 50 words, which you want our editor to know before deciding whether to publish your work.

Book Topics We Prefer

We publish **fiction, nonfiction, music, poetry**; etc.

Hot nonfiction topics include:

1. Business.
2. History.
3. Self-help / psychology.
4. Diet / weight loss.
5. Others.

No further religion books will be published because our staff is busy making spin-offs from our best-selling religious work, *A Still Small Voice*, winner of the Vital Literary Prize Triple Crown 2008-2012 bestowed by the Conservator of the GovernorsLibrary.org.

Topics We Do Not Do

We never publish the following topics:

1. Porno.
2. Romance novels.
3. Hate speech.

4. Any other material we consider to be inconsistent with the golden rule, our marketing goals, and our editorial world philosophy.

Hot Topics We Are Actively Seeking

Business (applications / software; models; strategies for success; entrepreneurial creativity; exposés on conspiracies and charlatans, etc.).

Politics offering novel explanations of global affairs (e.g., *A Still Small Voice*) and solutions to crises (e.g., *The Holy Lexington Empire*); exposés on conspiracies and charlatans.

Science and technology, especially a broadly applicable thesis like the Mandelbrodt equation; or, practical applications of new discoveries like medical treatments and new products (industrial nanotechnology, etc.).

Date and Sign Your Statement

Your proposal must end with the following items:

1. A dated statement, signed by you under penalty of perjury, that quote: “I hereby certify under penalty of perjury, that the work depicted herein is entirely my own original work, and I own all rights (or I am the authorized representative of the person who owns all rights to the work).”
2. —Your signature.
3. The date you signed the statement.
4. A copy of the copyright registration if you claim to be the authorized representative of the person who owns all rights to the work.
5. Mailing address and phone number of the person who owns all rights to the work, or your mailing address and phone number if it is your work.

Note: This information must be provided for each author on works with more than one author. Each author must also sign your book proposal in accordance with the penalty of perjury statement above.
